### THE SCHOOL

Roseville High School is a public school located in the community of Roseville fifteen miles north of Sacramento. The attendance area serves the northeastern part of the city of Roseville. It is primarily a suburban middle class community. The school, which serves grades 9-12, received a full six-year accreditation in 2009, from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

Roseville High School is on a four-by-four block schedule with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in four classes each term, which is equivalent to two traditional semesters. Therefore, each semester-long course at Roseville High School is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school.

The student population is approximately 1,994 students with a senior class of 475. The racial/ethnic composition consists of: 62.2% Caucasian, 17.3% Hispanic, 6.7% Asian, 4.6% African-American, 2.7% American-Indian and 5.2% Filipino-Pacific Islander and .5 not specified.

### MARKING SYSTEM

Letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F are used. A cumulative grade point average is computed using a 4.0+ scale and includes all work completed in grades 9 through 12. The transcript includes both weighted and unweighted GPA as well as a State GPA, which excludes freshman grades, as well as all physical education grades. Advanced Placement, Honors, and some Community College classes, that are Board approved and transferable to the University of California, are weighted. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA, unless the grade is an "F" grade, in which case it remains as part of the GPA calculation.
